A NOTE FROM OUR BOARD VICE-PRESIDENT

Dear Church Family and Friends of Trinity,

As we step into a new year, it is fitting to pause and reflect with grateful hearts on the year behind us. It was a year of both joy and struggle—marked by surprises, challenges, moments of sadness, and times of uncertainty. Yet through it all, God has carried us, blessed us, and shaped us with His steadfast love, mercy, and unfailing faithfulness. *“The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases; His mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is Your faithfulness” (Lamentations 3:22–23).* Gratitude steadies us. As we recognize God’s faithfulness, our hearts are prepared to step into 2026 with joy, hope, and deep thanksgiving. I’m ready—how about you?

The old has gone, and the new is here. God invites us forward with this promise: *“Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past. See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness. (Isaiah 43:19)* When I read that verse my heart is filled with excitement and holy expectancy, that God is up to something good amongst us—even when it’s hard.

When we dig into God’s Word, we are reminded again and again that we serve a God of the unexpected—a God who delights in working through untrained, unqualified, flawed, and ordinary people to accomplish extraordinary things. Scripture is filled with such stories: Abraham and Sarah, an aging couple long past hope; Joseph, an entitled teenager; Mary, an unwed young girl; David, a man deeply broken by sin; Peter, a disciple who quit when fear took hold; and Jacob, a deceiver and schemer. Even Bethlehem—a small, seemingly insignificant town not unlike Carrington—became the birthplace of our Savior. Time and again, God proves that He moves in ways we do not anticipate.

These stories remind us of a powerful truth: there is nothing we can do to disqualify ourselves from being people God chooses to work through. That truth should inspire us.

We serve a good and gracious God—one who uses ordinary people within our congregation to accomplish His will in unexpected and beautiful ways. And He is with us. Immanuel. Just because God did not answer our prayers in predictable or familiar ways in 2025 does not mean He is not listening, too busy, or absent from our lives. Jesus assures us, *“I am with you always, to the very end of the age” (Matthew 28:20).*

God continues to use the unexpected to do amazing things. Before us lie new opportunities, new relationships, and fresh beginnings. How might God be stirring your heart to take part in His work within this community of believers we call Trinity Lutheran? I am eager for all that God desires to do among us. Even now, He is at work—shaping, growing, and preparing each of us for what lies ahead in 2026. Do not ignore His call; embrace it. For God often calls His people in the most unlikely and unexpected ways to accomplish His purpose.

As we move into 2026 together, let us pray for one another and the church, remain rooted in biblical truth, and press onward in holy expectation.

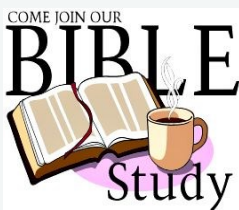

BUDGET NEWS:

We would like to take a moment to share an important update regarding our church's finances. We believe that transparency is essential, and that the congregation should always be aware of both our blessings and our needs.

For at least the past year, our weekly offerings have been down. While we are grateful for every gift that has been given, our weekly giving has rarely met our weekly need. Even though we actually operated under budget in 2025, and even though we have planned an even leaner budget for 2026, we are currently operating with a deficit. While this is not completely unusual, or the first time this has happened, we still believe that sharing this information is essential.

We will have some upcoming expenses related to our pastoral search. These are necessary and important expenses for the future of our church, but they do add to our financial responsibilities in the coming months.

The purpose of sharing this today is not to pressure anyone, but simply to make sure our church family is informed. We know that people can only respond to needs they are aware of. At the same time, we want to express our deep gratitude for the generosity so many of you have already shown. Your faithfulness keeps our ministry going, and we truly appreciate it.

We trust that God will continue to provide for our church, and we trust that he will guide each of us in how we can play a part—through prayer, through service, and, as each is able, through giving.

Thank you for listening, thank you for caring, and thank you for being the church.

President Michael Simons called meeting to order and opened with a prayer.

Current bills to be approved and paid in December: Leever's \$ 192.31, Dakota Dust Tex (rug rental) \$183.05, Julee Erdmann (blast \$28.16, funeral \$9.99, funeral \$75.74) \$113.89, Jodi Davis (blast pizza) \$349.44 and Karlee Griffin (thankoffering recipient) \$1,223.00. ** Brenda made a motion to approve the treasurers report and pay present bills and bills we are waiting on. Kristen seconded. All were in favor.

Vice Presidents Report: Julee reported that there was three coffee hours for November, and two funerals. **Julee also mentioned that she never heard from Linda Schuster about the advent program. Not enough interest/helpers. ** Julee talked to Tom Sauby about what he thinks we should serve and charge for funerals. It was decided to offer only four options. Pricing will depend on what option the family chooses.
