#### A NOTE FROM OUR BOARD PRESIDENT

Dear Members and Friends of Trinity,

Over the past several weeks, our church family has experienced a range of emotions following Pastor Richie's resignation. For some, this news brought sadness or even surprise; for others, perhaps relief or understanding. No matter where each of us finds ourselves, I want to begin by acknowledging the confusion and pain that can accompany changes in ministry.

It is clear that God called Pastor Richie to Trinity, and it is equally clear that God now has plans for both Trinity and Pastor Richie that lead us in different directions. We may not always understand, or even like God's plans, but we can place our faith and trust in them. God has not led us astray; He continues to guide us toward His purposes.

The Board of Deacons is working diligently to secure pulpit supply and ensure consistent pastoral care. We are also beginning the process of finding an interim pastor as we seek our next pastor. You may recall that we contracted with Vanderbloemen, a pastoral search firm, to bring Pastor Richie to Trinity.

Because we are still within their two-year guarantee period, they will again assist us in identifying our next pastor. We will soon form a new Call Committee to lead that process.

While this is a time of transition, it is also a time of opportunity. 
